Professor Dame Sarah Springman DBE FREng is Principal of St Hilda's College, Oxford. Educated at Wycombe Abbey and Cambridge University, she earned an MPhil and PhD in Soil Mechanics and became first female Research Fellow at Magdalen College, Cambridge. In 1997, she joined ETH Zurich as Western Europe's first female Professor of Geotechnical Engineering and Switzerland's first female Civil Engineering Professor. An expert in soil-structure interaction and natural hazards, she served as ETH Rector from 2015 to 2021. A former international triathlete for Great Britain, she helped secure Olympic and Commonwealth recognition for triathlon and received a Lifetime Achievement Award at the Sky Sports Awards in 2013.

Zahira is Head of Middle East Relations at the Bill & Melinda Gates foundation. She has over a dozen years of experience in the field of development, advocating for policy change, cementing partnerships and leading investment projects. She later joined the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development in London, spearheading the Bank's engagement efforts in the Gulf region. Before Elvie, she was Director of Evidence, Strategy and Innovation at Marie Stopes International, and earlier oversaw HIV prevention policy at UNESCO. An Oxford psychology graduate with a PhD from LSHTM, she now supports and invests in health tech founders.

Dr Eva Coates is an NHS surgeon, educator and founder of Clinical AI Partners (CAIP) Oxford, a venture bridging the NHS's AI-fluency gap. With her team at Clinical AI Partners, she delivers hands-on training that equips clinicians, educators and operational staff with AI safety and fluency, while building a data engine that maps NHS readiness for healthcare AI. His work encompasses trial design and governance, implementation in low-, middle- and high-income countries, trial statistician collaboration and clinician engagement to ensure evidence changes care. Several of these trials have been published in high impact journals and have led directly to updates in national and international guidance and to measurable changes in clinical pathways and training. He maintains active collaborations with clinical networks, guideline committees and international bodies including the World Health Organization and implementation partners to translate trial findings into practice.

Stacey's research interests include enhancing access to rehabilitation and primary team-based care in collaboration with rural, remote and Indigenous communities using virtual health technologies including remote presence robotics, smart glasses and virtual reality. She works closely with First Nation and Métis communities and interest holders to enhance culturally responsive, anti-racist and anti-oppressive healthcare. 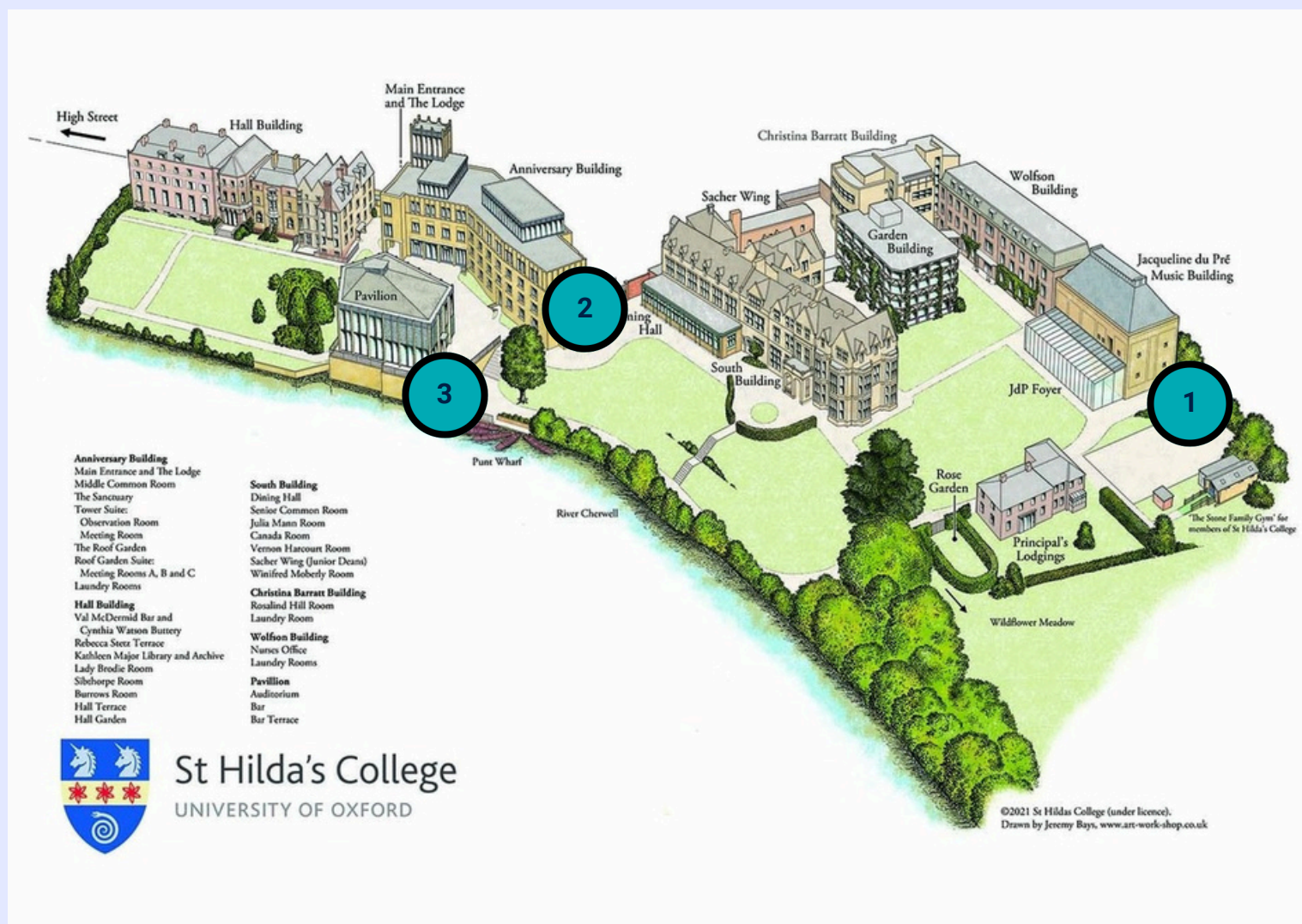
