



**Steve Le Fevre** is an award winning network television & radio presenter. Nationally, he hosted *The Biggest Game in Town* & *Watch to Win* on ITV Daytime. His credits also include BBC Radio Five Live where he wrote & presented the weekly *Media Show*, and was a regular presenter of *Late Night Live*. For the last six years he has presented the *Breakfast Show* on BBC Radio Bristol as well as appearing on the evening TV news programme & The Politics Show on BBC 2. He was an anchor man for the BBC in Northern Ireland prior to moving to Yorkshire Television where he fronted news, entertainment programmes & documentaries. He also won a prestigious Sony Gold Award for his radio talk show.

**Caroline le Fevre** is a network TV & Radio producer and media consultant. For 8 years she was the North of England Producer for Radio 4's *Woman's Hour*. Prior to that she was a senior producer for the BBC in Northern Ireland and produced *Woman's Hour* from there. She has also produced the Radio 4 consumer show *You & Yours*, Documentaries & shows on BBC Radio2. She has presented her own radio shows on numerous stations across the country and her TV work has included news and lifestyle programmes for ITV, Yorkshire Television's *Calendar* and *Tonight* programmes & Channel 4.

She runs Lefevre Media and helps companies deal with sensitive national news stories.

**Sheila McClennon** is a regular voice on BBC Radio 4 where she can often be heard presenting *Woman's Hour*, *Pick of the Week*, *You and Yours* & *Any Answers*. Other Radio 4 programmes have included *Saturday Live*, the religious affairs programme *Sunday* and *The Message*. Sheila co-hosted 5Live's late night discussion and phone-in *After Hours*. Her TV experience includes presenting BBC1's daytime magazine *Primetime* and she was also a reporter for the London evening news television programme *London Tonight*. As well as working in local radio on Merseyside and the West Midlands Sheila had a most enjoyable year taking famous people out to lunch before they appeared on Wogan's famous TV chat show.

**Vernon Harwood** is an award-winning radio & TV presenter, producer and journalist. He can regularly be heard presenting news and feature shows on radio stations across the South and West as well as producing and reporting for BBC Radio 4. He was BBC Radio Gloucestershire's *Breakfast Show* host for 10 years and fronted the TV discussion programme *Person to Person* for BBC West. In 1995 he made a full time move to TV as political reporter/producer for the BBC's *Out of Westminster* programme. Away from the microphone he was Managing Editor of BBC Radio Gloucestershire and BBC Wiltshire Sound. Vernon has covered major news events including IRA bombings, the Fred West murders and the floods of 2007. In 2010 he won a prestigious Silver Sony Award for his moving commentary on the funeral of Harry Patch, the last British 'Tommy' to have fought in the trenches of the Western Front.

**Mark Dexter** works for Sky TV. He spent 16 years as a news editor and reporter on evening and weekly newspapers in Yorkshire and the North East before moving to Yorkshire Television's flagship evening magazine show *Calendar* in 1999. Since turning freelance in 2001, he has worked for Talk Sport Radio, Channel 5, and, for the last decade has been a regular face on Sky News and Sky Sports News. Over the years he has worked on major national stories such as the Falklands War, the Bradford City fire and the hunt for Raoul Moat. He has interviewed many big names of the day from former Prime Ministers Tony Blair and John Major to football managers Sir Bobby Robson and Sir Alex Ferguson and legendary sportsmen such as George Best, Fred Trueman, Kevin Pietersen and Martin Johnson.
