SCAN publication

Claire Friedemann Smith & Julie-Ann Morland led a recent publication detailing the patient characteristics, serious disease diagnoses and incidental findings of the Suspected CANcer (SCAN) cohort. Non-specific symptoms present a diagnostic challenge in primary care, and can be indicative of multiple benign and serious conditions, including cancer. Rapid diagnostic centre-based non-specific symptom

pathways have been rolled out in the National Health Service across the UK as an urgent referral route. The SCAN Pathway was introduced as a non-specific symptom pathway pilot in Oxfordshire in 2017, and later adopted as standard of care in 2020. This study aims to describe the patients referred and outcomes during the first 6 operational years of the SCAN Pathway. You can read the full article [here](#)
