Eligibility: Priority will be given to early career researchers (ECRs). For purposes of this activity, an ECR is defined as per UKRI 2023 definition. Applicants should at minimum be in process of completing a PhD, or are doctoral, immediately post doctorate, or transitioning to independent researcher.
