

# Citizens' voices making change: enhancing the impact of citizens' juries and citizens' assemblies

Over the next few months this study will be running in Southampton. The research aims to help us understand more about how citizens' assemblies can be designed and carried out to have maximum impact.

## Who is carrying out and funding the study?

The researcher is Dr Alison Chisholm from the Nuffield Department of Primary Care at the University of Oxford. The project is funded by the British Academy Innovation Fund scheme.

## How does the study affect me?

To understand more about methods that aim to enhance the impact of the Southampton citizens' assembly, Alison Chisholm will sometimes be present in meetings concerning planning, delivering, attending or following up the citizens' assembly. She might ask to look at documents, observe meetings, and/or have informal conversations with staff. She will make every effort to avoid disruption and will ask people's permission first. She may also write confidential notes on these activities. The aim is not to judge anyone, but to better understand what might help and hinder efforts designed to increase the impact of the citizens' assembly. You may decline permission when asked or opt out in advance by contacting the researcher directly.
