

TRISH GREENHALGH

Professor of Primary Care Health Sciences Trish is a medical doctor and internationally recognised academic in primary health care and digital health. She leads research at the interface of social sciences and medicine, focusing on digital innovation, health equity, and humanistic care. Her work has shaped understanding of technology adoption, narrative methods, evidence implementation, and Covid-19 responses. She directs Oxford's MSc and DPhil in Translational Health Sciences and has published nearly 500 peer-reviewed papers and 16 textbooks. Honours include an OBE, Fellowships of major UK medical colleges, election to the US National Academy of Medicine and UK Faculty of Medical Leadership and Management.



ANNE FERREY

Senior Researcher and Course Director, MSc Translational Health Sciences Anne is Course Director of the MSc and DPhil (PhD) programmes in Translational Health Science at the University of Oxford. An experienced behavioural scientist, she teaches intervention design and health behaviour change theory and practice across multiple programmes. Her module, Behavioural Science and Complex Interventions, explores how behavioural science can drive sustainable innovation in healthcare. Anne has a particular interest in mental health, with a focus on developing creative and arts-based interventions to enhance health and wellbeing.



RACHNA BEGH

Deputy Course Director, MSc Translational Health Sciences Rachna is Deputy Course Director of the MSc in Translational Health Sciences programme and research lecturer at the University of Oxford. Her research focuses on tobacco addiction and smoking cessation interventions, primarily in people with chronic diseases and severe mental health conditions. She is co-leading an NIHR programme grant investigating the effectiveness of mental health professionals giving brief advice, an offer of an e-cigarette and ongoing support to people with serious mental illness who smoke and have declined help to quit.



Sally has worked in Enterprise Education since 2018 and is a Fellow of Enterprise Educators UK as well as a Fellow of Advance HE. Before joining Oxford as the Science Division lead for Enterprise Training she was at Robert Gordon University in Aberdeen. Before moving to Higher Education, she worked in tax and film finance and ran a creative business. At Oxford she has responsibility for the running and strategic development of a portfolio of programmes and initiatives that support the growth of mindsets and skillsets for Innovation, Impact, Enterprise and Entrepreneurship.

Nick is professor of policy analysis at the RAND School of Public Policy. Medical Humanities Programme Leader Stuart's career in biomedical science has spanned developmental neuroscience and neonatal brain injury, before moving into interdisciplinary work within osteoarthritis. At Oxford, Stuart has been the strategic head and operations manager for the innovation policy think tank – Centre for the Advancement of Sustainable Medical Innovation (CASMI), co-leading projects in the UK and EU looking at the multi-stakeholder dimensions of enablers and barriers to sustainable medical innovation in healthcare.

Alberto is a philosopher based at the Uehiro Oxford Institute. He works mostly in public health ethics and medical ethics. He is Project Manager for the Oxford team of the EU funded <u>CAVAA</u> project, investigating ethical implications of AI awareness. He has published a book, co-authored, on Rethinking Conscientious Objection in Health Care (2025), one on The Ethics of Vaccination (2019), and, in Italian, La Morale al Tempo della Bioetica (Morality in the Time of Bioethics) (2011).

PRITESH MISTRY

Fellow, Digital Technologies The King's Fund Leila is a physician and strategy consultant passionate about transforming healthcare across Africa through innovation. She began her career as a general practitioner in Accra, Ghana, before pursuing an MSc in Translational Health Sciences at the University of Oxford as an AfOx Mastercard Scholar. Transitioning from clinical care, she now works in the health innovation space, engaging with policies, strategies, and initiatives that support the scale-up of impactful solutions such as pharmaceuticals, digital health, and AI in healthcare.

Lennard is a national cancer vaccine lead and medical oncologist working at the interface of clinical medicine, health systems innovation, and research delivery on major national flagship programmes. Lennard leads programmes to advance cancer vaccine science, improve national clinical trial infrastructure, and introduce digital and AI tools into frontline cancer care. He is Chief Medical Officer of the Ellison Institute of Technology, where he runs the EIT Oxford Clinic for translational research. His has received multiple awards, including the Government Science and Engineering Award, the DSIT SciTech Superhero Award and more recently the national policy award for the UK Oncology forum.

Bill-Erich is a medical doctor from Cameroon, graduating with honours in Medicine from the Faculty of Medicine and Pharmaceutical Sciences at the University of Douala. He recently completed a Masters in Applied Digital Health at the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences, University of Oxford and is an Mastercard Foundation Scholar and Linacre College alumnus. He is the CEO and founder of Jalpha Health Tech, a start-up providing digital solutions to support hospitals in Africa transition from paper-based to digital health systems. Bill is passionate about using digital health to address challenges in Africa's healthcare systems.

Pritesh's work focuses on how digital tools and technologies can improve healthcare. He is passionate about using evidence-based digital technology to improve quality of care and outcomes. He combines his technological expertise with the essential ingredients needed to create impactful digital change, including culture, unmet need, infrastructure, change management and knowledge, to improve quality, inequalities and outcomes. Pritesh led the innovation activity at the Royal College of General Practitioners encompassing system change, entrepreneurship, grassroots innovation and horizon-scanning. Previously he worked at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Trust bringing together clinicians and patients with research and technology to improve the care of people with life-debilitating conditions.

Chrysanthi leads a research programme on the social study of digital health, using qualitative methods to examine how sociotechnical innovations are co-produced, implemented, spread and sustained in complex healthcare settings. She led the qualitative evaluation of the implementation and national roll-out of the NHS App as digital front door in England, and mixed-methods research on the co-design, delivery and spread of (remote) group consultations. Chrysanthi leads CHRYSANTHI PAPOUTSI the evaluation of a government initiative introducing online health checks in general practice. Her previous work focused on remote monitoring in epilepsy and heart failure in the UK, as well as supporting post-discharge care for vulnerable babies in Kenya.



SANJA ŠĆEPANOVIĆ

Sanja is a Senior Research Scientist at the Responsible Al Research Lab of Nokia Bell Labs in Cambridge, UK, and a Visiting Scholar at the The Uehiro Oxford Institute for practical ethics at the University of Oxford. She has published in leading conferences and journals, including NeurIPS, CHI, AIES, CHIL, and CSCW. 
MARCUS VASS
